DANCE ACADEMY returns for a second series

The first series of **Dance Academy** was a huge success when it screened on ABC1 and ABC3 in May, June and July, quickly becoming the most popular series screened on ABC3 since the channel's launch in December 2009.

On 4 July the Sunday Age described the series as "one of the most mature, well written, well acted and well produced Australian teen dramas in years." The reviewer went on to say that the series "concludes tonight ... with enough loose ends for a second series."

The ABC and German public broadcaster ZDF have both commissioned a second series, which has now been financed with the support of Screen Australia, Screen NSW, ZDF Enterprises and the Australian Children's Television Foundation. The series is produced by Joanna Werner of Werner Film Productions.

Carla De Jong, ABC TV Children's Head of Commissioning and Development says:

"We are thrilled to be commissioning a second series of this high quality drama. The massive success of **Dance Academy** on air and online has proved a strong connection with our audience. **Dance Academy** is the highest rated drama on ABC3 and has become a channel defining brand for us."

The second series is currently in pre-production and filming will begin in Sydney on 31 January 2011 and continue until 4 August 2011, for delivery to the broadcasters in 2012

My Place series 2 goes into production

After extensive casting and location searches the second series of **My Place** started filming in and around Sydney on 20 September 2010. Filming will continue until 17 December 2010.

The series is produced by Penny Chapman and Matchbox Pictures, with the ABC, Australian Children's Television Foundation, Screen Australia, Screen NSW and Screen Tasmania. The ACTF will distribute the series internationally.

The series continues the adaptation of the picture book, written by Nadia Wheatley and illustrated by Donna Rawlins. In **My Place 2** the series goes back in time for a further 13 episodes (1878–to before time).

Meanwhile, the 1928 (Bridie) episode of **My Place** has been selected as a finalist in the International Children and Youth Film Festival (FICI) in Spain.

Calling all filmmakers 15 years old and younger!




The ACTF, ABC3 and Tropfest have once again teamed up to present Trop Jr and the call is out for short film entries for the 2011 Trop Jr festival.
